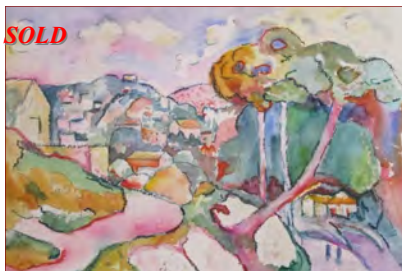

1880 COTTAGE GLOWS FOR ART GALLERY

THE history to the present Queanbeyan Art Society Gallery building goes back to 1880. It is known as O'Neill's Cottage and has bricks only an artist could paint. From an article in the Canberra Times Sunday March 4 1984 by Roger Green: A prizewinning painting of an old house sparked the idea of restoring the house to provide a centre for the Queanbeyan Art Society. The winner of the Society's 1979 Art Exhibition was won by Peg Minty's oil painting of O'Neill's Cottage (the Society logo today). The cottage was about to be demolished in 1980 when Queanbeyan City Council offered it to the Society. The article went on to describe the bricks. It is a beautiful little cottage with outstanding brickwork giving off a soft orange glow in the evening light. The bricks are actually a mixture of two stocks from different contractors, as shown by the differences in colour and methods of laying. The bricks have acquired a soft smooth texture from the several floods the cottage has survived since its dunking in the Queanbeyan River in 1891. The Art Society gained the lease when the building was derelict. With support from Council, community groups and individual donations the cottage started to function as a Gallery. At the time the Society had two major Exhibitions a year and continued small shows, art classes, talks and other art related activities. The faith and foresight our forbears had has proven fruitful because in 2010 the Queanbeyan Art Society will have 12 major Exhibitions, art classes every day, a monthly Newsletter, a members art Calendar and will be heading towards a 260 strong membership base.

Like the bricks it is hoped the Society will continue to glow into the future!

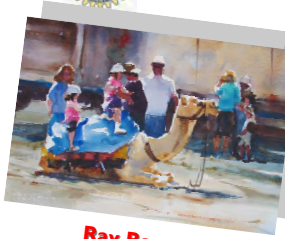

QUEANBEYAN PROCLAMATION DAY

Sunday 3 October marks the 172th anniversary since the proclamation of Queanbeyan as a settlement in 1838.

"Queanbeyan has a very rich history, dating all the way back to 3 October 1838 when it was first proclaimed a settlement. In the 172 years since that event the city has evolved and is now one of NSW's fastest growing cities," Queanbeyan Mayor, Cr Tim Overall said. "It's very important to continue to recognise Queanbeyan's history, and Proclamation Day will further enhance the community's awareness of our history."

When Queanbeyan was proclaimed back in 1838 it had a population of just 40 people and has now grown to become a significant city with the population estimated to reach around 70,000 by 2031.

The original name given to the area was Quinbean, an Aboriginal name said to mean "clear waters" or "beautiful woman". Robert Dixon, the surveyor for the area, changed the spelling to Queanbeyan in 1834.

James Larmer designed the town in April 1838, and laid it out on a square mile of land with the streets arranged in a "grid" pattern which has survived to this day.

Queanbeyan was a central service town for the surrounding region and was proclaimed a municipality on February 3, 1885. At that time it consisted of 5700 acres or nine square miles, with 223 rateable properties, three public halls, seven hotels, two banks, two grist mills, 55 shops and factories and 22 holdings of lands enclosed and unenclosed.

On 5 July 1972 Queanbeyan was declared a city and its population had exceeded 15,000 people.

MEMBERSHIP Ian moved and Belinda seconded that the following application for membership be approved: Lenilson Da Silver of Queanbeyan Proposer Jean Helmers. Carried

GENERAL BUSINESS Workshops Cheryl reported that there were several enrolments for the Next Workshops on October 23-24. Flyer should be ready for inclusion in next newsletter. Awaiting images from tutors.

Smith Family Exhibition Government House Belinda moved and Karen seconded that the committee ratify the decision to support the above exhibition March 6, 2011. Carried

Riverside Plaza Exhibitions Ian and Belinda reported exhibitions going well with 2 paintings sold - Sold paintings by Artists Philippa Kirkby-Jones and Pat Fleming.

Rotary Barry confirmed that all sponsorships to be made out to Rotary and receipted by Rotary. Entry fees to be made out to QAS and receipted by QAS Sale proceeds to be paid to and receipted by QAS Raffle ticket sales to be handled by QAS.

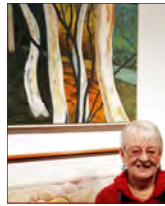
MARGARET IS ALL SMILES
